 - I was confident last year to ask questions and would like to continue this
 - Not afraid to be outspoken
 - Understand how the committee works

 - Senator for IHRA, second meeting in student government
 - Residence Hall director of communication
 - Wants students to have their voices heard
 - Great way to help people in unfortunate situations
 - Questioning Phase:

- Momaney: You will be in a room where you are advocating for students across campus, and there is a lot of confusion about fees. How will you ensure that these fees stay at a reasonable cost?
 - Gopa: It is supporting the people that need you the most. I routinely talk to different people on campus, and I don't find people intimidating usually. While there is a learning curve, I think I would pick it up quickly
 - Holliday: Last year I was constantly in intimidating experiences, and I have the connections to reach out as needed to put into use in this scenario. It is important to find ways what students truly want and need as I did in the past year.
 - Peddesani: I have worked on campus while campaigning as
 president of IHRA and sitting across from professionals is
 intimidating but it is getting past those nerves and you are here to
 represent the students. I am a quick learner and want to help others
 adapt.
- Kammeyer: Can you talk about your experience in budgets?
 - Gopa: I am fiscally responsible and will fight to the last penny. I have experience in the Senate advocating for student dollars.
 - Holliday: I would say I have immense experience when it comes to planning money. I also served on the parking committee which discussed ticket costs and fines (which we did not increase last year). Outside of Iowa State, I had my own business to fund coming to college and currently I am budgeting to get to college
 - Peddesani: I have worked with the director of finance with my residence hall to reallocate funds. I have also worked as an intern as a financial analyst to manage asset portfolios.
- Snyder: How do you plan to educate the student government about what happened in the committee weekly with the black box?
 - Gopa: I will try to reach out to discuss these things that I am allowed to talk about, so more outreach such as Instagram posts.
 - Holliday: I didn't share the contents, but shared what I could such as when we had meetings and during the voting. I do ask students random questions to help take into consideration before I decide how to vote.
 - Peddesani: I have worked under NDAs and also one to provide information without giving things away.

o Debate Phase:

■ Everheart: I think all nominees are great, but want to put my support behind Holliday as she is passionate about student government and

affordability in general. She has experience about what the committee is. It is also helpful that she has those personal connections to decide what is best. She has a wonderful opportunity to be an intern at a national level which goes to show how driven she is and how effectively she would be able to advocate for students.

- Jones: I also want to support Jennifer, she has made great connections with faculty who believe in her mission. She has a passion for where student dollars are going at a national level and has done things with Senator Ernst.
- Kammeyer: I want to share my support for Peddesani. When we went through the budget he had plenty of questions. While I understand experience is important, I think he is the right person for the job.
- Eisma: There are lots of difficult discussions that happen within this committee. We cannot talk about things because of the sensitive nature of the data. I am supporting Holliday as she has experience and has interacted with a lot of the faculty.

• Clarification Phase:

- Momaney: to Gopa: when you say you want to get the most out of student dollars, these resources are used. Would you try just to keep costs low or work to make the dollar work?
 - We would look at the feasibility, conduct an analysis, and make a decision
 - At the end of the day, I would do what they want not what I personally would do
- Spahn: to Holliday: could you elaborate on your experience advocating for affordability at the federal level?
 - There have been issues with the FAFSA such as response time and changes negatively impacting farmers and small businesses owners
 - I've been working with Senator Ernst to reverse these negative changes
 - I have gone to Washington DC and participating in a roundtable event
 - I am also working on creating a video to continue to share my story
- Everheart: to Holliday: Can you talk about how your internship will help your role?
 - I will be working with the Ministry of Education including those in the financial areas to see how the finances work
 - I will be immersing myself in international culture that will help me represent international students

- o Final Comments:
 - Gopa: While I don't have experience I do have a different perspective. I will try to use those experiences to ask questions that will further the student experience. I am a decent communicator and help create awareness.
 - Holliday: Thank you for the opportunity. I hope my experience shows how worthy I am in this role. I want to connect with students and this is something I have done and will continue to do so.
