- Stump in the road, the parking department has raised the rates for the minimum ticket is 50\$ which was previously the maximum
- Mopeds and motorcycles are also covered and we want to be able to help as many people as we can
- Combines food insecurity, and parking tickets being paid, and our students don't have to come up with money for unexpected expenses
- Kammayer: Motion to amend to make the maximum \$60 instead of \$50
  - Objected by Everheart: would this change the line item?
    - Yes, suggest including the line item change
- o Kammeyer: Withdrawn amendment and yield time
- Hagan: We are not changing the line item amount, just the number of tickets that could be paid
- o Gopa: Why the \$60 again?
  - Last year the minimum amount was \$30 which changed to \$50 over the summer
- Gopa: Are we sure this will be enough?
  - This is a pilot program so we are trying to give room for this to grow
- Gopa: Are you in talks with the parking division?
  - Yes, they wanted us to pay for it so as long as we are paying for it they have no problem with it

- Momaney: The quantity would be 83 instead of 100 and would bring the cost down by \$20 overall. Does that sound correct?
